1. **Johannes Janssonius** (Dutch, 1588-1664). *Indiae Orientalis, Nova Descriptio* [*Dutch Map Of The East Indies*], 1630. Engraving, text including title in plate overall, 42.7 x 56.7cm (paper). *Soiling and minor rubbing overall, repaired tears, creases and missing portions.*

Text includes "Amstelodami. Ioannes Janssonius excudebat."

Original as issued. Important early map of Southeast Asia and the Philippines, and a landmark in the mapping of Australia, first published by Jan Jansson in 1630. This

is also the only Dutch printed map showing the 1606 discoveries of Willem Jansz, who in the *Duyfken* is attributed as making the first recorded European discovery of Australia, mapping the Cape York Peninsula. Ref: NLA.



2. **Johannes Janssonius** (Dutch, 1588-1664). *Mar Di India*, 1650. Hand-coloured engraving, text including title in plate overall, 43.8 x 55.9cm. *Centre fold, slight foxing overall, minor cockling and discolouration to margins. In bird's-eye maple frame.*


Important map showing discoveries up to but not including Tasmania.

3. *After Francis Wheatley* (British, 1747-1801), engr. **Henry Macbeth-Raeburn** (Brit., 1860-1947). [*Captain Arthur Phillip*], 1786/1936. Mezzotint on chine collé, proof before letters and colouring, signed and annotated "2nd state proof in progress" in pencil below image, 62.9 x 42.7cm. *Minor soiling, crinkles and tears to plate mark and margins.*

Engraved by Henry Macbeth-Raeburn after a 1786 oil painting by Francis Wheatley. This mezzotint, normally issued with hand-colouring, is a rare uncoloured proof. The portrait, depicting Phillip in his captain's uniform, standing on a coastal shore, was painted in 1786 probably in anticipation of his voyage to Australia. Ref: NPG, UK, NLA.

This image is the only large, full-length portrait of Captain Phillip.





4. **After John Cleveley the Younger** (Brit., 1747-1786). *View Of Huaheine, One Of The Society Islands In The South Seas [Tahiti]*, 1787. Aquatint with etching, text including title and artist's name in plate below image, 43.6 x 60.2cm. *Foxing overall. Framed.* **\$6,600**

Text reads "Drawn on the spot by Ja's Cleveley. Painted by Jn'o Cleveley, London. F. Jukes aquat. To His most Sacred Majesty George III, of Great Britain, France & Ireland, King, defender of the faith, this view of Huaheine, one of the Society Islands in the South Seas, is most humbly dedicated by His Majesty's most dutiful & devoted subject and serv't, Tho's Martyn." A

photocopy of the original prospectus, circa 1788, is affixed to frame verso.

This is one of four views issued after the watercolours by John Cleveley, based on drawings by his brother, James, the ship's carpenter who sailed with Captain Cook on his last voyage on the ship *Resolution*.

This print is a very rare uncoloured proof of the first impression which was sold for 18 shillings in 1788. It is an exceptionally strong impression with good margins, differing in quality from the standard issue which tends to be a much lighter printing and is normally hand-coloured to hide any weakness in the impression. (Ornithorincus rufus N. masc.)... This engraving was in the atlas published for the Peron and Freycinet expedition *Voyage de Decouvertes aux Terres Australes. Atlas par Mm. Lesueur et Petit*. Paris: De l'Imprimerie Imperiale [1807]. Ref: NGA.

Text includes "Published by G.&W. Nicol, Pall Mall, Feb. 12, 1814." Engraved by L. Scott to illustrate Matthew Flinders' voyage.



7. **Joseph Lycett** (Aust., c1775-c1828). *View Of Captain Piper's Naval Villa, At Eliza Point, Near Sidney [sic], New South Wales*, 1825. Hand-coloured aquatint with etching, text including artist, title and date in plate below image, 23 x 32.4cm. *Slight offsetting to upper portion of image, minor foxing and stains overall.* **\$1,850**

Text includes "Lycett delt et execut'l. London, published May 1, 1825, by J. Souter, 73 St Paul's Church Yard."



8. **Louis Auguste de Sainson** (French, 1801-1887). *Perruche À Collier Jaune, Mâle and Perruche À Tête Pourpre, Mâle [Australian Parrots]*, 1830. Pair of engravings, text including plate number, artist and title in each plate above and below image, 40.9 x 26.7cm (approx. each). *Minor foxing and crinkles, stains to edges of margins, slight rubbing to lower portion of image.*

Text in each plate includes "Voyage de l'Astrolabe - Zoologie. Oiseaux. Nouvelle Hollande. J. Tastu édit." Text also includes "Pl. 23. J.G. Prêtre pinx. Manceau sc. Son bec vu de face" and "Pl. 22. A. Prévost pinx. Mafsard sc. Port-du-Roi Georges."

The engravings are from the *Astrolabe* voyage, captained by Dumont D'Urville, from 1826 to 1829. Ref NLA.



9. **Indenture Between James Mudie And William Smith**, 1831. Letterpress document on paper watermarked "J. Whatman, Turkey Mill, 1825", inscribed, dated and signed in ink in various hands including Bishop Broughton, head of the Church of England, and William Lithgow, Auditor-general, 40.2 x 25.2cm. *Missing portions and tears to edges, slight discoloration and creases overall.* **\$1,650**

William Smith was only 8 years old, an orphan when he was indentured to Mudie until age 21, in 1844. James Mudie (1779-1852), a Scottish-born free settler of Australia, was an officer of marines who was eventually dismissed, a large landowner in Hunter River district, a brutal and unpopular magistrate in Maitland, and the author of a controversial book published in London in 1837, titled *The Felony of New South Wales*, which "ferociously" attacked anyone who Mudie thought had in any way opposed him. 10. **Portrait Of William Lamb, Lord Melbourne**, 1833. Lithograph on chine collé, text including Melbourne's facsimile signature, artist and date below image, 45.8 x 36.6cm (image). *Slight soiling, crinkles and foxing overall, tears to margins.* **\$2,950**

Text includes "Plate 2. Drawn on the stone by B.R. Haydon from the original study for the picture of the *Reform Banquet*, now painting for Earl Grey, and gratefully dedicated to his Lordship by his permission. Published by Tho's McLean, 26, Haymarket, London, June 25th, 1833. Printed by C. Hullmandel." Held in the National Library of Australia collection.

An unusual and rare portrait of Lord Melbourne.



12. **After Charles Rodius** (British/Aust., 1802-1860). *Vue De La Rade De Sydney Et Du Fort Macquarie, N'lle Hollande (View Of Sydney Harbour And Fort Macquarie, New Holland)*, c1838. Hand-coloured lithograph, text including artist's name and title above and below image, 26.3 x 40.1cm. *Slight discolouration, stains to margins. Framed.* **\$4,950**

Text includes "Voyage la frégate la Vénus. Atlas pittoresque. Ménard del't. Lith. de Thierry frères. Lith. par Bichebois. Fig. par Bayot. Pendant le séjour de la Vénus en 1838." A rare view of Sydney based on a more European interpretation of the original 1833 drawing by Charles Rodius: the Aborigines in the foreground have been removed and French soldiers have been added. G.J. Austin, an early Sydney lithographer, also made a print of this view after the Rodius drawing in 1836. Ref: NLA, SLNSW.



14. **Grant Of Land Signed By Sir George Gipps**, 1842. Letterpress document on parchment with affixed embossed official seal, stamped, inscribed with dates and signed in ink in various hands including Sir George Gipps, Governor-in-Chief, and E.D. Thomson, Colonial Secretary, stamped verso, 35.7 x 44.1cm. *Soiling, cockling and old folds overall, minor tears to edges.* **\$1,250**

The land, in the parish of Willoughby and Neutral Harbour (the original name of Neutral Bay), NSW, was granted to David Wallace by Sir

Ralph Darling in 1830, but the present document was signed by [Governor] Sir George Gipps in 1842. The land was originally granted as "a special reserve, for the formation of a whaling or other mercantile establishment."



11. **After William John Huggins** (Brit., 1781-1845). [*H.M. Revenue Cutter "Prince George", On Voyages To And From Sydney*], 1836. Pair of hand-coloured aquatints with etching, text including artist, engraver, date and title in plate below image, 31.2 x 45cm (image). *Slight foxing and stains overall, with trimmed plate mark.* The pair **\$8,800**

Text in one image includes "Painted by W.J. Huggins, Marine Painter to His Majesty, and published for him May 1836, by F.S. Crawley, 105 and 106, Leadenhall St, London. Engraved by C.

Rosenberg. To his Royal Highness Prince George of Cumberland, K.G., this plate representing H.M. Revenue Cutter *Prince George* of 72 tons, John Roach, Commander, on her voyage from London to Sydney, New South Wales, off the island of St Pauls, encountering a tremendous hurricane in lat. 39½ S, long. 78 E, August 1833, is with His Royal Highness's permission most respectfully dedicated by his obliged and humble servant James Roach." Text in the other image includes "...this plate representing H.M. Revenue Cutter *Prince George*... on her voyage from London to Sydney, New South Wales, in lat. 5 N, long 24 W, May 8th, 1833, chasing the French E.I. Ship *Victorine* for the purpose of putting letters on board, the *Victorine* supposing her to be a pirate crowding all sail to get away..."

It is extremely rare to find these images together as a pair. Ref: NLA.



13. **Campbell And Child Family Ephemera, Sydney**, c1840s-1870s. Group of five items comprising a colour lithograph valentine's card addressed in ink and postmarked "General Post Office, Sydney, Feb. 17, 1840", William Campbell's visiting card, a newspaper cutting of an obituary, an ambrotype and a miniature oil portrait, most items accompanied by typed caption slips, sizes from 3 x 2.4cm to 23.1 x 18.9cm. *Tears, creases to card; ambrotype accompanied only by brass mat (no case); surface loss, crazing to miniature.*

The valentine's card was sent by William Campbell to Martha Bean. The obituary is for William Campbell and his wife Martha, of Redfern, aged 32 and 31 "leaving four children, the eldest only 6 years of age." William Campbell migrated to Australia from County Antrim, Ireland, in the 1830s, and was a solicitor in the Criminal Crown Solicitors office in Pitt St, Sydney. He married Martha Bean 1845; they both died in June 1852, and were survived by four children. In 1875, their daughter Augusta Mary Georgia Campbell married Henry George Child (Jnr), pictured as a boy with his father in the ambrotype, and as a grown man in the miniature. 15. **George Knight Erskine Fairholme** (Aust., 1822-1889). *Australia [Cattle Droving, Queensland]*, c1853. Three hand-coloured lithographs, each initialised "G.K.E.F." in image and titled in ink below image, one annotated "No. 5" in ink above image, 17.3 x 25.4cm (approx. each). *Slight stains and minor paper loss with some repairs to margins, old mount burn.*

All titles include "Australia", and read "Branding cattle in a 'pen'; Drafting cattle on horseback; Taking away a draft of young cattle." The images are significant for colonial Queensland as they are some of the very earliest depictions of the emerging colony and of life on Darling Downs at the time.



17. **Old Convict Hulk "Success"**, c1857. Albumen paper photograph, stereo card format, titled in negative lower right, 7.9 x 15cm. *Foxing and discolouration overall, laid down on original backing.* **\$660**

Success was an Australian prison ship and convict hulk, built in 1840. Formerly a merchant ship which traded around the Indian subcontinent, *Success* was sold to London owners and made three voyages with emigrants to Australia during the 1840s. On 31 May 1852, during the height of the Victorian gold rush, *Success* arrived at Melbourne and the crew deserted to the gold-fields. Due to an increase in crime, the government of Victoria purchased large sailing ships, including the *Success*, to be used as prison hulks. In 1857 prisoners from *Success* murdered the Superintendent of Prisons John Price, the inspiration for the character Maurice Frere in Marcus Clarke's novel *For the Term of His Natural Life*.

16. **Nathaniel Whittock** (Brit., 1791-1860). *The City Of Melbourne, Australia*, 1855. Engraving with roulette, text including title, engraver, artist, key and date in plate below image, 29.1 x 52.9cm. *Soiling, repaired missing portions, tears, trimmed plate mark. Laid down on acid-free backing.* **\$9,900**

Text includes "Drawn by N. Whittock, from official surveys and from sketches taken in 1854, by G. Teale, Esq'r, Melbourne. London. Published May 1, 1855 by Lloyd Brothers & Co. 22 Ludgate Hill." The key lists 47 locations.

Very rare important view of Melbourne, produced at the peak of the gold rush in Victoria, showing the great changes to the city.



18. **John Dunmore Lang's Victoria Land League Membership Card**, 1857. Engraving on card, dated in plate lower centre, inscribed and signed in various hands in ink, 7.8 x 11.4cm. *Slight foxing.*

Text includes "J. Mitchell sc. 69 Collins St West." The membership card belonged to the Rev. John Dunmore Lang, (1799-1878) who was a Scottish-born Australian Presbyterian minister, writer, politician and activist. He was the first prominent advocate of an independent Australian nation and of Australian republicanism. The Victoria Land League and Land Convention was established in 1857 to fight the Haines government's land bill that advocated an alternative measure based on free selection, abolition of sale by auction and open pasturage over crown lands. Well-known public figures of the time had a deputation to request the government to withdraw its land bill. Ref: ADB.



19. **"Australian Album" [Music]**, 1857. Hardcover songbook of engraved sheet music with ten tinted lithographic illustrations by Edmund Thomas, most illustrations signed and some dated in image, 35.4 x 26.5cm. *Offsetting, foxing, slight soiling, minor crinkles and tears with some repairs to some pages, stains and wear to cover, repairs to spine and hinges.* **\$5,500**

Title page includes "Sydney, J.R. Clarke, Music Publisher, George St. Alan & Wigley Lith. Printers." Text in some illustrations includes title and composer of each piece of music. This is the first Sydney songbook, published in NSW. It contains eight Australian musical scores for a popular audience. Although individual songs and sheet music scores had been printed previously, this is the first complete published musical album. The frontispiece portrait of Miska Hauser (1822-1887) who was a prominent violinist of his time, does not have his facsimile signature located below the image, as illustrated in the copy held at the National Gallery of Australia. 21. **Freeman Bros** (Australian: William, 1809-1895; James, 1814-1870). *[Portrait Of A Man]*, c1865. Hand-coloured albumen paper photograph, oval format, photographer's label verso, 16.4 x 12.9cm. *Archivally remounted in original bird's-eye maple frame.*

Label reads "Freeman Brothers Gallery of Photography, 231 George Street, Sydney." Back of frame has a rare original early label "R. Smith, Picture Frame Maker, 7 York Street, one door from Barrack Street."

It is rare to have the original labels for a Sydney photographer and framer together.



22. **Attrib. Charles Percy Pickering** (Aust., 1825-1908). *Sydney Infirmary [Macquarie Street]*, c1870s. Albumen paper photograph, titled in pencil on backing below image, 20.2 x 27.6cm. *Slight soiling to upper right corner, laid down on original backing.*

The Sydney Infirmary, built by Governor Macquarie, was opened in 1816 with one large central and two smaller wings. Today the northern wing houses the NSW state parliament and the southern wing, the Mint. The large central segment was demolished in 1876 to make way for the new Sydney Hospital in 1881. 23. **[Old Government Boatshed, Circular Quay, Sydney]**, c1870s. Albumen paper photograph, typed caption in label affixed to backing verso, 15.1 x 20.2cm. *Foxing, laid down on original backing.*

Caption reads "This photograph shows the old Government boat shed in the 70's on the east side of Circular Quay where the Horse Ferry used to land its passengers. The position was later occupied by the P&O Co." Printed text on label reads "Library of Australian History, 17 Mitchell St, North Sydney NSW 2060."

24. **Manly Beach**, c1870s. Albumen paper photograph, numbered "145" in negative lower right, titled on backing below image, 15.8 x 20.7cm. *Slight foxing, laid down on original backing.*

Image shows the old wharf, in the location of the present Manly Wharf. Visible on the wharf are a Manly Beach Steamer timetable and rail tracks for goods. Signs in the background read "The Pier Family Hotel" and "Ivanhoe Park Hotel and picnic grounds."



25. **Louis Buderus** (Australian, fl. 1874-1887). *E&O Schubert, Wheelwrights and Bank Auction Rooms, [Rockhampton, Queensland]*, c1870s. Stamp reads "Louis Buderus, photographer, East St, Rockhampton. Copies on application."





26. **Frank Jesse Taylor, Maker Of Cricket Bats, And His Family, Victoria, c1870s-1890s.** Group of seven items comprising four albumen paper photographs, a hand-coloured tintype, a wood engraving and letterpress card, and a colour digital photograph, most captioned in various hands in ink or pencil verso, two with photographer's line or stamp on backing, sizes from 6.3 x 4.5cm to 10.2 x 15.3cm. *Slight foxing and stains overall, some scuffs and uneven surface to tintype.*



Kangaroo Flat" and a price list for various types of new cricket bats, wickets, balls, and repairs to cricket bats. The digital print is a modern copy of an earlier image of Charles Taylor and his wife.

This is the earliest known cricket trade card in Australia.



27. **Attrib. Josiah Stevenson (Aust., c1830-1894).** *The Grafton Steam Punt, c1872.* Albumen paper photograph, carte-de-visite format, titled in blue ink with a partly obscured printed photographer's line on backing verso, 2.7 x 9.9cm. *Foxing overall, laid down on original backing.*

The Grafton Steam Punt was launched in 1868. Photographer Stevenson arrived in Grafton circa 1871-1872, eventually taking over J.W. Lindt's studio in 1876. Ref: Davies, *Mechanical Eye*, 1985.



28. **Punch's Hotel, Corner Of Pitt St And King St, Sydney, 1872.** Albumen paper photograph, captioned in ink on accompanying slip, 27.5 x 21.5cm. *Slight foxing and stains to upper portion. Framed.*

Caption continues "Now occupied by Proud's Jewellers' Shop. 1872. Presented by E. Butcher, Esq."



29. **Grant Of Land Parcels In Alfred Street And Macquarie Place, Circular Quay, Sydney, 1873.** Handwritten document bound with original cloth tape, seven pages, on paper watermarked "Partridge & Cooper, No. 1 Chancery Lane", signed and dated in ink by two witnesses in 1873, various signatures replicated in document including that of Governor Charles Augustus Fitz Roy and Governor John Young, 42 x 34cm. *Old folds, stains and crinkles overall, minor tear and surface loss to cover page due to oxidation of ink stain.*


Attested 1873 copy of a grant of land made in 1855 by Charles Augustus Fitz Roy (with an amendment signed in 1864 by Governor John Young) to Sarah Wentworth and Henrietta Hill, as tenants in

common, "on the condition that [they] construct proper drains through and from the said land to the nearest common drain or sewer..." The granted parcels were in Circular Quay, bounded by Alfred and Arbitration Streets and Reiby Lane, and in Macquarie Place, near the Tank Stream and close to the place of landing of the First Fleet in 1788.

30. **John Hubert Newman (Aust., 1835-1916).** *[NSW Naval Brigade Portraits], 1875.* Albumen paper photograph, captioned and dated "24th May 1875" in image lower centre, photographer's blind stamp on backing below image, 26.8 x 20.5cm. *Slight foxing overall, minor surface loss to upper edge, laid down on original backing. Framed.*

Caption reads "Presented by the officers of the NSW Naval Brigade to their commanding officer Captain Hixson." Photographer's stamp reads "Photographed by J.H. Newman, 12 Oxford St, Sydney." The NSW Naval Brigade was commanded by Captain Francis Hixson from 1863 to 1888. Some of the Brigade members took part in the Boxer Rebellion in 1900.



31. **Hay, NSW, c1877.** Albumen paper photograph, titled in ink and annotated in pencil in various hands on backing below image, 21.7 x 27.1cm. *Soiling and foxing to upper portion, laid down on original backing.*



Text includes "Married Women's Property Bill has become law, whereby it is enacted that married women can purchase land and hold the same, independent of their husbands. Secure sites for all your children for Christmas presents. The ladder to wealth, invest your money in land... F. Bradley, Land Salesman, Bathurst, is the auctioneer for Mt Clare Estate, Penrith, December 20th, 1882... Walter Akhurst & Co., Printers, York St., Sydney."



36. **Public School, Bondi [Wellington Street]**, c1883. Albumen paper photograph, titled in pencil on backing below image, 24.4 x 29.7cm. *Slight stains to edges, laid down on original backing.*

The school opened in March 1883 and within a month the enrolment had grown from 66 pupils to 89. Ref: Bondi Public School.

Arthur Syer, brother of the artist Walter Syer, was a friend of cartoonist Phil May and supplied him with selected 'snapshot' photographs of ordinary people in daily life, which assisted Phil May in creating the life-like quality of his drawings. Syer's low angle photographs were taken surreptitiously, using a pocket camera. Such cameras, sometimes concealed in parcels or portmanteaux, were made possible with the invention of daylight-loading roll film in 1891. Kodak was among the first to release its pocket camera in 1895. Le Hunte served as President of Dominica, Secretary of Barbados and Mauritius, and Lieutenant-Governor of British New Guinea. As South Australian Governor, he became the first patron of the Royal Automobile Association of South Australia when it was formed in 1903. Towards the end of his career he was Governor of Trinidad and Tobago. The District Council of Le Hunte in the north of Eyre Peninsula was named after him before it was changed to Wudinna District Council in 2008. Ref: Wiki.

In 1877 Brooks joined the Department of Lands in Sydney as a surveyor and was a major contributor in the surveying of NSW (being an intrepid explorer and mountain climber, Brooks travelled to near-inaccessible areas).

The centre panel depicts the character "The Little Boy from Manly", created by Hopkins in 1885 in relation to the Sudan War. This concept was later reworked and issued in 1898 as an etching, using an elderly man instead of a boy. Another panel, concerning a humane approach to using ostrich plumage for hats, refers to the Women's Christian Temperance Union (WCTU), founded in Victoria in 1894.

Ellis Rowan was one of Australia's most adventurous and talented natural history artists, specialising in flowers and birds, and occasionally insects. Born in NSW, Amandus Julius Fischer (1859-1948) was a renowned cartoonist, painter and prolific illustrator of his time. He contributed to a number of newspapers and magazines including the *Illustrated Sydney News* and the *Town and Country Journal*. Fischer is best known for his 1890s *Bulletin* cartoons. His work was exhibited at the 1898 Grafton Gallery exhibition "Australian Art in London." He helped illustrate Steele Rudd's *On Our Selection*, published in 1899.

in the world. It runs from Halls Creek in the Kimberley region of Western Australia to Wiluna in the mid-west region. In 1906, the government of Western Australia appointed Alfred Canning to survey a route which was proposed to break the monopoly held by the west Kimberley cattlemen on the beef trade. In 1908 Canning was appointed to lead the construction of 48 wells for the stock route.



The Gadfly was an illustrated weekly periodical founded by C.J. Dennis in Adelaide in 1906 to showcase his and 16-year-old co-founder Archie Martin's writing talents. The magazine featured stories, verse and articles on the arts and the general Australian social scene. The two founders started the venture on limited funds of £100 raised through family and friends. The magazine lasted for three years. The staff of *The Gadfly* consisted of C.J. Dennis, editor; Archie Martin, sub-editor; Beaumont Smith, drama and sport; writer Geoffrey Burgoyne; journalist Alice Grant Rosman; and Will Donald, artist. Ref: AusLit; ADB.

out panorama of Sydney Harbour, printed by John Sands, Sydney; images of the fleet in Melbourne, printed by "Osboldstone & Co., printers and publishers, Little Collins Street"; information on NSW with the title of "A Welcome to New South Wales, Australia, for the United States Fleet"; and a "Programme for Sydney, 20th-27th August, 1908", printed by William Applegate Gullick, Government Printer, Sydney.

Known as the Great White Fleet, the American convoy was the first major visit by any foreign naval power to Australia since federation. The fleet, which consisted of 16 battleships painted white, toured the world as a demonstration of US naval might. The visit attracted a quarter of the Australian population, who welcomed the fleet at the wharves of Sydney, Melbourne and Albany. This visit marked a turning point in the relationship between the two nations. Ref: *SMH*, 2009.

This booklet in German text was an important record of the Liverpool-Holsworthy Concentration Camp (also known as Holsworthy Internment Camp), which operated from 1914 to 1919. The booklet illustrates the camp and camp life with photographs and drawings, showing accommodation and recreation areas. The camp housed over 6,800 men in 210 buildings in over 25 acres. Initially the camp had a recreation centre, sergeants mess, sawmill and sandstone quarry, used for the construction of some of the buildings. By mid-1915 it had four theatres, one for moving pictures, tennis courts, football grounds, a band pavilion, and a camp orchestra.

The booklet also has an image of the captured crew of the German cruiser SMS *Emden* (see item 101). Held in SLNSW and NLA collections.

Italian-born, Dr Charles Albert Monticone, a translator and handwriting expert, became the Chief Italian Interpreter for the government of NSW. From 1914 to 1916 he worked as a translator at the Liverpool-Holsworthy Concentration Camp, which was predominantly German but also had other foreign nationals.

Other photographs and ephemera relating to the camp are available on request.

Its personnel were infantry mounted on camels for movement across desert. The Corps, which was founded in January, 1916, was formally disbanded in May, 1919.

It states that Martin was born in Adelaide and resided in Sydney. The photographs, which depict Martin, are stamped "Britain Photo Studio," signed, annotated "Egypt, 26.4.1917," and inscribed to his siblings Gwen and Archie in ink on image and verso (see item 84). The headline in the November 12, 1918 copy of *The Daily Telegraph* reads "Official: Armistice Signed."





This was followed by *Through the Joke in Class* in 1923, a parody of *Through the Looking Glass*. These two smallish, limited edition works were issued by the author

in association with publisher W.C. Penfold & Co. They included illustrations by Collingridge and made use of the artificial language Esperanto. Alice

is presented in a distinctly Australian setting with kangaroos, emus and other local fauna accompanying her on a journey from Alice Springs. ...Both works are now extremely rare." Ref: Michael K. Organ, extracted from "Alice in Oz...", University of Wollongong, 2013.

It is interesting to note that the parody *Through the Joke in Class* involves Alice revisiting Australia to deal with problems in the laying of the foundations for the Sydney Harbour Bridge.



The foundation committee consisted of James Cant, Roy Daigamo, Roderick Shaw, Hal Missingham, John Oldham, Adrian Galjaard, Bernard Smith, Herbert McClintock, and Dora Cant. According to Bernard Smith, SORA was formed to "bring art into closer relationship to contemporary life. The founders of the Studio believe that art today can only be revitalised if the artist is prepared to draw upon the varied experience that he will gain from the world about if he has the vision to see and the humanity to feel." 
